Why is my report important?

Sharing good news..

Help with writing the report

Tips:

- Keep it short! 200-250 words is ideal.
- A picture is really important - ideally a selfie of you on the course. It doesn't have to be perfect!
- A word document is best, or PDF

- ☑ The fund who provided the money and how much (find this on your PGT acceptance email or ask us)
- Some examples of what you learned on the course Perhaps a skill you improved? Something that impressed you?
- What impact you hope it will have on your work/career
 Will you be able to bring new skills to your current job?
 Perhaps you might now consider promotion? Or a career move?
